From Bishop Serratelli:

The collection offers a way for us to stand in solidarity with those who experienced decades of Soviet control and who continue to feel the effects of poverty, infrequent pastoral care and a lack of buildings in which the faithful can worship.

This collection provides grants that focus on training seminarians and lay leaders, supporting social service programs, youth ministry, catechetical centers, schools, church construction and evangelization. Teaching the Catholic faith to generations who lived under Communist rule is vitally important. Your participation in the Collection for the church in Central and Eastern Europe brings hope to many and unites us with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

In today’s second reading, St. Paul urges the Corinthians to “do all for the glory of God.” If we follow that advice in everything we do, we cannot help but be good stewards!

Ashes to the Sick & Homebound – Deacons and Special Ministers of the Eucharist may bring blessed ashes to the sick and those confined to homes. Family members and others may do the same if needed. Please see Fr. Tarantino in the Sacristy after the Masses/Service to pick up ashes prepared for Shut-ins.

Lenten Regulations - Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fast and Abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are Days of Abstinence. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast by this obligation. The individual is permitted only one full meal in the day. From the age of 14, all are obliged to abstain. The law of abstinence forbids eating meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind even though made from animal fat.

Sacrament of Reconciliation in the Lenten Season - Saturday time is extended from 3:00pm to 4:30pm.
