Note: Because of the HIPPA laws, hospitals and Rehab facilities do not let Parishes know of patient's religious affiliation. Family members can let their Parishes and these facilities know for Sacramental administration and Prayer List additions.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available to the sick, the infirmed, the homebound, the pain of addiction and the dying. Please call the Pastoral Care office or the Main office to schedule an appointment with Fr. Tarantino.
