Resurrection's Annual Baby Shower collection drive is going on now. Next weekend is the collection weekend. **Anyone interested in helping collect, sort and, batch the items donated for the Baby Shower drive is welcome.** Volunteers will be working in the Community Room on Sunday, June 2nd from 8:30amish (after the 7:30am Mass) until we're done (hopefully, before midday). Whatever time you can give is appreciated. Just a reminder: unwrapped donated items are preferred. Bulk packages of diapers are fine. However, for most other items (formula, lotion, shampoo. . .) standard sized packages are preferred, as several of the organizations provide clients with a pre-set kit of baby products on a regular schedule for a set period of time. Giant bottles or containers don't work for these programs, as they need multiples of standard-sized products to include in the kits. A bulk package that contains several regular size containers of a product will work. All items listed on the ornaments must be new (tags must be on them).

Please consider using a \$scrip program purchased gift card to make your purchase to do twice the good. See the \$scrip article for more information. Samaritans' volunteers are willing to shop for you if you'd prefer to donate a gift card to be used toward a requested item. All items listed on the ornaments must be new. If anyone has any used baby items to donate, contact Tammy in the Samaritans' office, as one of the agencies will accept gently-used items.

In order to be included in the distribution to participating organizations, all donated items must be in by 11:00am on Sunday, June 2nd.

Your cards will be ready for pickup after Masses just as they are for those who use a paper order form.
