### **MINISTRY TO THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND**

Jesus said, "Do not be afraid". We have much that can cause fear to overcome us, but when we affirm the Lord's presence within us, we are gifted with His perfect love encompassing the ability to live unafraid. In Matthew's Gospel today, Jesus tells us not even a sparrow will fall to the ground without the Father's knowledge. Even so, He knows every inch of each one of us and cares for us in every moment of our lives. Here at Resurrection Parish, we have a Homebound Ministry for those who cannot get out to Church either from advanced age, any illness or for those recovering from surgery. To set up a visit from a Eucharistic minister, one need only call the Pastoral Care number above. Phone messages are checked every day and will be returned as soon as possible. Short term or extended time, ministers are available to bring Communion each week.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available by calling the Pastoral Care Office number above or the Main Office number on the front of the Bulletin to set up an appointment for a visit. The homebound can receive this Sacrament every year or when facing surgery, or are preparing to go Home to the Father.

### **MINISTRY TO THE BEREAVED**

The time of bereavement can be very fearful. Whether we have sustained shock from the sudden death of a loved one or sat at the bedside of one preparing for their journey Home, so many fears can flood our thoughts and we feel very much alone. When we rely on our faith, call on the life of prayer we have been taught, attend Mass and receive the Eucharist regularly, we find immense support not only from fellow parishioners but from the peace and comfort that comes from Jesus and, from Him, the understanding that our loved ones have attained the reward waiting for each and every one of us. Grief work is difficult but must be done to come to the healing that allows us to go on with our lives in a new way.
