Family Promise is a not-for-profit organization dedicated to ending the crisis of homelessness faced by Morris County families. They recognize that poverty and homelessness are multi-faceted problems that require a multi-faceted response. Their services integrate educational outreach, innovative programming, community advocacy, and the hands-on work of thousands of volunteers. Their programming is designed to address the cycle of generational poverty and homelessness, as well as the emerging challenges that many families face for the first time having economic difficulty. All of their services foster children and families' determination to maintain physical and mental health, in addition to financial stability, independence, and permanent housing in the community. “Jesus alone is our peace who makes us one through his flesh.” We are surrounded with many things in our day to day lives.
