God's presence guides us through the difficulties of this life as we come to know the goodness of the Lord each day.

## MINISTRY TO THE BEREAVED

When the burden of grief is so heavy and the pain is so deep, we wonder if we will ever feel "normal" again. Our world is so unfamiliar. It can take a bit of reaching inside ourselves to begin to restore focus and take the next step. Our faith tells us that place is where we find Jesus who is ready to guide us through our thoughts, fears and anxieties and walk with us on the path to healing. The sacrifice of the Mass and the reception of the Eucharist are the purest connection to Christ and to our loved ones.

If a loved one is dying, the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is celebrated to give comfort and strength to the dying person. It is followed by Communion, if possible, that becomes for them Viaticum which is food for the journey. The prayers of commendation of the dying to God are said for the spiritual comfort of the one who is dying.
