The rebates vary by store. But, as an example, if 10 Resurrection households purchase one \$100 grocery store gift card each from a store with a 4% rebate, Samaritans earns \$40 to use to help others in need. There are a lot more than 10 households in our parish community; and, on groceries alone, a lot of us spend more than \$100 each week. Please give \$crip a try!

The gift of His Body and Blood is the food by which we are nourished, and gives strength to do the right thing for all humanity. Wherever we are in our life, whether homebound or not, we face challenges, but the grace of God strengthen us and shows us the right path to take.

Because of the HIPPA law, hospitals are no longer permitted to let parishes know of patient's religious affiliation. Please have a family member contact us for Sacramental administration and Prayer List additions.

### **MINISTRY TO THE BEREAVED**

We grieve the death of our loved ones, no matter the manner by which God called them Home. No death is diminished from any other death. Grief is still painful and bereavement still takes time. When we embrace the love of God in Jesus, we are not alone on our journey. God's care of our loved ones is perfect, as He created them. God's care of us is ever present when we go to Him in prayer and when we go to the Table of the Lord Jesus in Communion.

If a loved one is dying, the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is celebrated to give comfort and strength to the dying person. It is followed by Communion, if possible, that becomes for them Viaticum which is food for the journey. The prayers of commendation of the dying to God are said for the spiritual comfort of the one who is dying.

Bereavement Support Group meeting is next Sunday, November 10<sup>th</sup>, from 12:30 to 2:00 PM, in the Resource Room. All who are grieving are welcome. By sharing with others, we learn from each other. Light refreshments will be available.
