### A Message From Bishop Serratelli

All parishes in the U.S. are taking up this month's special collection for two different and important causes: Catholic Home Missions and the Archdiocese for Military Services. (This collection will occur next weekend at Resurrection).

The Catholic Home Missions assist dioceses and parishes in our country that simply do not have the financial resources to provide even basic pastoral services to Catholics. Ministries and services that are common in our own parishes, such as Mass and the Sacraments, religious education, and ministry training are scarce in many parts of our country. These missions are located in areas such as Appalachia, the South and the Rocky Mountain States – everywhere that Catholics are small in number but are great in their hunger for the richness of our Catholic faith.

A portion of the funds will also support the Archdiocese for the Military Services. This Archdiocese serves the pastoral needs of those in military installations in many countries as well as patients in V. A. Medical Centers. The priests, religious, and lay ministers in the Archdiocese for Military Services serve over one million people. Having a Catholic presence available to those who serve us is a way to express our gratitude for their commitment to our country.

### **MINISTRY TO THE BEREAVED**

"For God is not a God of the dead, but of the living, for to God all are alive." Our loved ones are already experiencing the perfect love of God. It is for us to honor them by our lives well lived. We remember them, we miss them, we are sad sometimes and each day we take a step of acceptance and an experience of new life. When we listen to others who have been on the journey of bereavement, we often learn new ways of coping with our grief. The gift of the Mass, the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ, give consolation and connection to the sacrifice made for us and our loved ones.

If a loved one is dying, the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is celebrated to give comfort and strength to the dying person. It is followed by Communion, if possible, that becomes for them Viaticum which is food for the journey. The prayers of commendation of the dying to God are said for the spiritual comfort of the one who is dying.

The next Bereavement Support Group meeting will be Sunday, November 10<sup>th</sup> at 12:30 pm in the Resource Room. All who are grieving are welcome. By sharing with others, we learn from each other. Light refreshments will be available.
