REMINDER: Our 2019 Thanksgiving Turkey and Food Drive collection is being held next weekend. If a loved one is dying, the **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** is celebrated to give comfort and strength to the dying person. It is followed by Communion, if possible, that becomes for them Viaticum which is food for the journey. The prayers of commendation of the dying to God are said for the spiritual comfort of the one who is dying.
