MINISTRY TO THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND

"You will show me the path of life, and guide me to joy forever." Ps.16. Jesus followed His path on earth, the path He was sent to take. Constant communication with His Father allowed Him to live His humanity. It had its joys but also its sorrows. In the end, His greatest joy was securing salvation through the Cross, for all of us. Though, we too, are often in difficult situations, it is for us to follow the path we were sent to take. It, also, has its joys and sorrows. Constant communication with the Lord in our life brings the greatest joy.

Fr. Tarantino is available to administer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to the homebound. Forgiveness of sin is part of the Sacrament so that even if they cannot speak, reconciliation is granted. Even if you are homebound for a short time, recovering from surgery and/or rehabilitation, you can still receive Communion at home from one of our Ministers of the Homebound. Wheelchair bound folks who are able to be brought to Mass will have Communion brought to them.

MINISTRY TO THE BEREAVED

The Light of Christ shines in the darkness of our grief. The hard part for us is accepting having to grieve in God's timing rather than ours. It is so difficult to let go. Even Jesus, in His humanity, asked to be relieved of the bitter cup, yet knew it was His journey to take. We know if we are privileged to journey with one who is dying. One who is taken suddenly leaves us with no clear path to take. It is, for all, to follow that Light of Christ that dispels the shadow of grief.
