MINISTRY TO THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND

There is a common bond among us all that takes our struggles and turns them into compassion for others. The old saying, that unless we walk a mile in someone else's shoes, we have no idea what they are going through. Because we all have suffered, we have the ability to offer sympathy, empathy and the desire to be of some help and support. This is what Jesus asks us to do. At the same time, we who are suffering can turn to the Lord and know that He hears every word, every cry and every need. When we have been gifted by the Lord, we can share that gift with others. Prayer is a constant companion at all times. With praise and thanksgiving, we have only to ask.

Fr. Tarantino is available to administer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to the homebound. Forgiveness of sin is part of the Sacrament so that even if they cannot speak, reconciliation is granted. Even if you are homebound for a short time, recovering from surgery and/or rehabilitation, you can still receive Communion at home from one of our Ministers of the Homebound. Wheelchair bound folks who are able to be brought to Mass will have Communion brought to them.

MINISTRY TO THE BEREAVED

It is said so often that the most difficult task of bereavement is learning to live without the physical presence of our loved ones. There is always a great empty space where the voice of that special loved one was loud and clear, soft and gentle, funny and serious comforting and loving, with a hug that held our burdens for awhile and we knew we would be ok.
