MINISTRY TO THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND

There is an old book called The Practice Of The Presence Of God by Brother Lawrence. His job was to serve the Lord in the kitchen. He teaches the reader how he includes the Lord in Prayer in everything he accomplishes in the kitchen. When we learn how to do that, we gradually learn to include the Lord in the ordinary every day things of our lives. In our sickness or confinement to home, we have an enormous opportunity to include the Lord in our thoughts and actions throughout the day. Our prayer of thanks and praise for His Presence in everything we do brings peace, contentment and consolation.

Fr. Tarantino is available to administer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick to the homebound. Forgiveness of sin is part of the Sacrament so that even if they cannot speak, reconciliation is granted. Even if you are homebound for a short time, recovering from surgery and/or rehabilitation, you can still receive Communion at home from one of our Ministers of the Homebound. Wheelchair bound folks who are able to be brought to Mass will have Communion brought to them.
